The Empty Tomb:

When I read about the resurrection of Jesus Christ, I see hope for humanity. This fact that death was defeated by the Son of God is, to me, the single most exciting act there ever was. God gave man, a sinful creature, the opportunity to be redeemed from a inevitable spiritual death. By the death of Jesus Christ, we now have salvation available to us if we choose to accept it. Remember what Paul said in:

1 Corinthians 15:1-5 (NKJV)

Moreover, brethren, I declare to you the gospel which I preached to you, which also you received and in which you stand, by which also you are saved, if you hold fast that word which I preached to you--unless you believed in vain. For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures, and that He was seen by Cephas, then by the twelve.

This one single action by Jesus is the most significant thing ever presented to man by God. We were shown through the Son that nothing is impossible for God. Even death couldn't contain Jesus in the grave. If God can defeat death, then He can also save man from death and extend eternal life to anyone who is willing to obey His Word. Remember what Christ said in:

But Jesus looked at them and said to them, "With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible." Humanity's greatest gift from our Creator was His only begotten Son Jesus Christ.
